Executive Summary

The Brian Crawford Memorial Baseball Heaven Campus is a transformative youth sports facility designed to drive youth development, community engagement, and economic growth in Shawnee, Oklahoma. This proposal seeks an initial Phase I funding request of \$10,000,000, structured as a 20-year note with monthly payments of \$92,000, backed by \$1.5M in guaranteed financial assets through facility lease agreements, banking partnerships, or reoccurring grants.

Baseball Heaven's service area will expand from **5,000 students** under the City of Shawnee to **49,307 students** within the **Pottawatomie County Little League**, positioning it as a hub for regional sports. The project is expected to generate over **\$137.3M in economic impact** by 2030, making it a critical driver for youth engagement and economic revitalization.

1. Cover Letter/Introduction

Baseball Heaven is an entirely new sports complex designed to meet the growing needs of **Pottawatomie County's youth** and to replace outdated infrastructure. The project builds on the success of the **Brian Crawford Memorial Sports Complex** and reflects a new direction, focusing on transparency, expanded access, and sustainable operations.

2. Project Overview

Baseball Heaven will feature baseball fields, softball fields, pickleball courts, and indoor training centers to host regional and national tournaments, offering state-of-the-art facilities for youth development and community sports engagement.

- Purpose: Address unmet community demand for high-quality youth sports facilities.
- **Impact**: Increased youth engagement, economic growth through sports tourism, and partnerships with local sports leagues, schools, and regional organizations.

Stakeholder Engagement: Baseball Heaven is supported by partnerships with the **Avedis Foundation**, **Shawnee Public Schools**, and local businesses, all of which are deeply invested in the community's well-being and growth.

3. Planning & Design

Current Planning Stage:

- Land acquisition is underway, with potential donation or purchase agreements with St.
 Gregory's Abbey.
- **Zoning approvals** are in progress, and initial environmental impact assessments show the project's viability for the selected location.

Milestones:

- Q4 2024: Land preparation and utility installation.
- Q1 2025: Begin Phase I construction.
- Q2 2025: Facility completion and event hosting.

Community input has been gathered through forums and discussions to ensure that the design reflects local needs and provides maximum benefits to youth and families.

4. Financial Overview

Total Project Cost: \$35,000,000

Phase I Request: \$10,000,000 (to fund initial construction and operational setup).

Additional Funding Sources:

- Sponsorships from local businesses and corporate partners (e.g., Love's Travel Stops).

Financial Projections: Baseball Heaven's financial model projects total revenue of **\$22M** by **2029**, with significant income generated from:

The need for this grant is paramount to initiate construction, with projected long-term profitability ensuring continued operations and maintenance.

• Revenue from field rentals, sponsorships, and tournament hosting will provide ongoing financial support, ensuring that the facility remains operational and sustainable.

6. Vendor & Contractor Overview

Potential Vendors and Contractors:

- Architectural firms: Working with experienced firms that have a track record of designing community sports complexes.
- **General contractors**: Vendors with experience in sports facility construction will be selected based on competitive bids, ensuring cost efficiency and high-quality results.

Vendor Selection Process:

 A transparent bid process will be used to evaluate vendors based on experience, cost-effectiveness, and past performance on similar projects.

7. Construction Timeline & Milestones

- Phase 1: Site preparation, land clearing, utility installation (Q4 2024).
- Phase 2: Field construction, building amenities like restrooms, snack bars, and seating (Q1 2025).
- Phase 3: Equipment installation, turf, lighting, final touches (Q2 2025).
- Phase 4: Grand opening and operational phase (Q2 2025).

8. Grant Funding Allocation

10. Challenges and Solutions: USSSA Monopoly and Florida Case Study

Oklahoma's youth sports landscape faces challenges due to the monopolized USSSA operations, which have limited access to affordable youth baseball and softball programs. These operations have increased costs for families, weakened community-based leagues, and restricted opportunities for competition.

Florida Case Study: In Florida, similar monopolization issues were met with a **community-focused solution**. By transitioning to local governance, leagues restored transparency and offered more affordable programs.

Baseball Heaven aims to implement a similar approach by:

- Fostering a community-driven model under Pottawatomie County Little League to ensure long-term sustainability.
- Breaking away from monopolized operations, offering local families affordable, accessible sports programs.

11. Umpire Compensation: Salary vs. Cash Payments

Moving from a **cash-based compensation system** to a **salary-based model** for umpires is a critical aspect of Baseball Heaven's mission. Cash payments have historically led to financial inconsistencies, legal complications, and a lack of transparency in many youth sports leagues.
